WHAT IS DENTAL TOURISM?

Dental tourism refers to the practice of traveling overseas to receive accessible, reasonably priced dental care, surgery, or treatments that are typically expensive domestically. This trend began as a result of the rapidly rising and unaffordable costs of healthcare. The western world's never-ending waiting lists and lengthy appointments contributed to the phenomenon's rise in popularity.¹

Dental tourism is defined by the American Dental Association (2009) as the act of travelling to another country for the purpose of obtaining dental treatment. Dental care is a subset of medical care where tourism has increasingly become prominent.²

There are two categories of dental tourists.

First, there are the traditional dental tourists, who go abroad for dental care, either as part of a vacation package or as their only reason for visiting a foreign nation.

Second, migrant tourists are individuals who travel back to their home country for vacations or to see family and who also receive dental care while there.³

WHY DO INDIVIDUALS SELECT DENTAL TOURISM?

People travel to other countries for dental care because of a variety of factors, including cost differences, variations in public and private healthcare financing, a lack of dental infrastructure in their native countries, and the high expense of dental care in those nations.⁴

Enormous savings for the patient. The primary motivator behind dental tourism is the financial savings resulting from the reduced expenses of dental services such as root canal therapy, veneers, fillings, crowns, dental bridges, implants, orthodontic care, etc. in the countries of destination.²

Economic benefits to the nation: Medical tourism help enhances the economies of developed countries as well as small or underdeveloped areas that would otherwise be rich in conventional medical practices. It does this by drawing high-end travelers from both developed and developing countries. It provides locals with business and employment opportunities.²

The pleasure of mixing adventure and travel with medical requirements is another advantage. For a lot of medical travelers, their first trip will be to Thailand or India. The leisurely vacation period that follows the medical procedure is

a significant part of the medical tourism industry. Destinations for medical tourism emphasize this feature equally as much as the caliber and affordability of their medical care.²

Medical tourism is even more beneficial when it comes to easy access to medical and technological facilities, diagnostics, and procedures.²

DENTAL TOURISM WORLDWIDE

Mexico leads the world in dental tourism because of its proximity to the United States, where 25 percent of dental tourists travel from. India and Hungary are tied for second place. While India treats Asian patients and shares some US citizens, Hungary is seeing a higher proportion of patients from Europe.⁵

Hungary has the potential to become the industry leader in dental tourism for a number of reasons. The cost-benefit ratio is excellent, to start. Second, a major factor is the remarkable high caliber of dental education. Thirdly, the materials used in dental offices are of an excellent caliber, comparable to that of Europe. In Hungary, 5% of cases involve dental complications.³

Probably one of the best locations for dental tourism is **Romania**. Dental implants and cosmetic surgery are just couple of the many services offered by Romanian clinics.

One of the relatively new dental tourism destinations offering top-notch dental care is the **Czech Republic**, with Prague as its capital. Less than 60% of the cost of the same care in the UK can be spent on cosmetic dentistry in a private clinic in the Czech Republic.

The majority of them offer the following kind of treatment: dental bridges, porcelain/ceramic crowns, whitening, maxillary surgery, extraction of implanted wisdom teeth, extraction of normal or damaged teeth under local anesthesia, extraction of ceramic caps without gold under microscopic control, Cosmetic dentistry, smile design, root canal, teeth whitening, tooth contouring and reshaping, dental fillings, palatal orthodontics, vertical and horizontal bone grafting, gum grafting and gum treatment, dental implants, and dental implants.⁸

- b) Possibility of post-operative complications developing following treatment with one's home country.
- c) Distinct legal frameworks for medical negligence across nations.¹⁰
