Across curriculum planning, This demonstrates that NAAC-related protocols likely enhanced transparency, structure, and scheduling in academic management. In academic assessment, students acknowledged improvements in mentoring systems, teaching-learning methods like street plays and smart classrooms, and satisfaction with syllabus revisions and MUHS-aligned evaluation processes In terms of research, consultancy, and extension, a small proportion still expressed neutrality or disagreement, indicating room for further strengthening of research culture and individualized support. Regarding infrastructure and learning resources, most students reported better access to facilities such as libraries, laboratories, ICT-enabled classrooms, and clinical placements. This aligns with NAAC's emphasis on resource augmentation as a criterion for accreditation. Student support and progression and women empowerment Students were especially appreciative of active SNA units, career guidance, anti-ragging awareness, and initiatives like Nirbhaya Pathak training and self-defense sessions—affirming NAAC's role in fostering safe, inclusive, and supportive educational environments. Innovation and best practices showed strong engagement in hands-on demos, infection control teaching,

These results are consistent with earlier literature that cites NAAC as an effective quality assurance mechanism driving reform in Indian higher education institutions.

#### Conclusion

On the basis of the findings, it can be concluded that NAAC accreditation significantly contributes to quality enhancement in nursing education by improving curriculum delivery, enriching student experiences, and ensuring institutional accountability. The comparative assessment revealed that educational standards and student satisfaction levels were positively influenced after NAAC implementation. While the overall responses were positive, a minority of students remained neutral or dissatisfied in select areas, suggesting opportunities for ongoing feedback and refinement, especially in research facilitation and individualized academic support. Thus, it is recommended that institutions continue to align with NAAC guidelines while also customizing strategies based on student feedback to sustain and deepen quality improvements. Further large-scale, multi-institutional studies are encouraged to generalize findings and strengthen evidence-based practices in academic governance and quality assurance.
